RING 1 STARTING AT 8:30

MHSA LEAD LINE EQUITATION

For children seven years of age and under on a pony. To be judged on equitation and suitability of mount at a walk. No martingales allowed. Children in this class are eligible to complete in Mini Stirrup.

1 On Lead Walk

MORNINGSIDE LEAD LINE EQUITATION

For children seven years of age and under on a pony or horse. To be judged on equitation and suitability of mount at a walk off lead and walk/trot on lead. No martingales allowed. Children in this class are eligible to complete in Mini Stirrup.

MHSA MINI STIRRUP

Open to ponies ridden by a junior exhibitor who have not reached their 11th birthday by December 1st of the current competition year. A rider may not cross enter into any other MHSA Regional division or class except Lead Line, where shows permit. Riders in this division may also not cross enter into any classes that involve cantering and/or jumping. Stallions shall be barred from all classes. No martingales allowed. To be judged on rider's hands, seat, guidance, control and suitability of mount. There will be 4 poles in class 6 to be ridden at the trot or canter.

CROSS RAIL HUNTER

Open to all riders on horses or ponies. Judged on soundness and way of going. To be shown over a course of no more than 8 cross-rail jumps not to exceed 18" in height, no penalty for simple changes. Riders may not cross-enter any other division where fence heights exceed 18". (Child and adult amateurs qualify for Colonial Classic only)

BEGINNER EQUITATION

Open to riders 17 years of age & under in their 1st or 2nd year of showing over crossrails on horses or ponies. Judged on position and overall ability and turnout. To be shown over a course of no more than 6 jumps not to exceed 18" crossrails in height. No penalty for simple changes. No oxers may be used. Riders may not cross-enter any other division where fence heights exceed 18".

LOW ADULT EQUITATION

Open to adult amateurs only. Judged on position and overall ability and turnout. To be shown over a course of no more than 8 jumps not to exceed 18" crossrails in height. No penalty for simple changes. No oxers may be used. Rider's may not cross-enter into any other division where fence heights exceed 18".

SCHOOLING BREAK

10-minute schooling sessions of no more than 10 horses at a time. For riders jumping 18'-2'

MHSA SHORT STIRRUP EQUITATION

Open to ponies ridden by a junior exhibitor who have not reached their 11th birthday by December 1st of the current competition year. A rider may not cross enter into any other MHSA Regional hunter, pleasure, or equitation division or class, except Short Stirrup Hunter and Lead Line, where permitted. In addition, riders may not compete in any jumper classes or classes where the height exceeds 18". Stallions are barred from all classes. No martingales allowed in flat classes. A course should consist of a minimum of 4 fences and a maximum of 8 fences. No oxers may be used. Fences shall be 18". Spreads not to exceed height of fence. To be judged equally on hands, seat, control of mount, and suitability of purpose.

MHSA SHORT STIRRUP HUNTER

Open to ponies ridden by a junior exhibitor who have not reached their 11th birthday by December 1st of the current competition year. A rider may not cross enter into any other MHSA Regional hunter, pleasure, or equitation division or class, except Short Stirrup Equitation and Lead Line, where permitted. In addition, riders may not compete in any jumper classes or classes where the height exceeds 18". Stallions are barred from all classes. A course should consist of a minimum of 4 fences and a maximum of 8 fences. No oxers may be used. Fences shall be 18". Spreads not to exceed height of fence. To be judged on performance, soundness, and suitability of mount.

MHSA LONG STIRRUP EQUITATION

Open to horses and ponies ridden by a junior exhibitor who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1st of the current competition and adult amateur exhibitors. Senior Amateur exhibitors must meet the requirements of USEF Rule GR1306. Your signature as rider on the entry blank and annual membership form will verify that you understand and are in compliance with the rule. A rider may not cross enter into any other MHSA Regional hunter or equitation division or class, except Pleasure Horse and Pony, where permitted. In addition, riders may not compete in any jumper classes or classes where the height exceeds 2'. Stallions are barred from all classes. No martingales allowed in flat classes. A course should consist of a minimum of 4 fences and a maximum of 8 fences. No oxers may be used. Fences shall be 18" – 2'. Spreads not to exceed height of fence. To be judged equally on hands, seat, control of mount, and suitability of purpose.

Open to all riders on horses and ponies. Judged on soundness and way of going. Fence height 2'. Oxers will be used. (Child and amateur adult qualify for Colonial Classic.)

MHSA PLEASURE HORSE/PONY

Horses and ponies shall be of any breed or combination of breeds suitable for English riding and normally used for pleasure. To be shown under English tack. Martingales are prohibited. Good manners are essential both in executing the gaits and while lined up in the ring. All horses and ponies must be serviceably sound. In the English Pleasure Division, all animals over 14.2 hands are horses and all animals under 14.2 hands and under are ponies. Classes may be divided by horses and ponies. Horse and pony classes with less than three entries will be combined. Pony classes may be divided by height of ponies. Small/Medium ponies under 13.2 hands. Large ponies over 13.2 hands and not exceeding 14.2 hands. Ponies must have a current MHSA measurement card (if USEF card is not available) on file with MHSA office prior to showing in this division. Ponies must be ridden by and handled by junior exhibitors in all phases of a class. Junior exhibitors shall not have reached their 18th birthday. Stallions are barred from all classes limited to junior exhibitors. For the purposes of the pleasure division the term "suitability" shall mean suitability to purpose as a pleasure mount. Jump height to be 2'. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot, and canter. To be judged on suitability of horse or pony to purpose, manners, and ability to give a safe, comfortable ride. May be asked to perform an extended trot or similar gate, asked to readily back and stand quietly, may not be asked to hand gallop.

SCHOOLING BREAK

10-minute schooling sessions of no more than 10 horses at a time. For riders jumping 2' - 3'

MHSA Junior and Adult Equitation O/F to be shown open card concurrently by fence height

MHSA JUNIOR EQUITATION

Open to horses and ponies ridden by junior exhibitor that have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1st of the current competition year. Junior Equitation may be split by age or by horse/pony. If split by age, it shall be split 13 & under and 14 – 17. To be judged equally on hands, seat, and control/suitability of mount. The over fences class fence heights shall be 2', 2'6", and 3'. The flat class to be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring. At the judge's discretion, other tests may be performed. Maybe combined with the Adult Equitation if there are less than 4 entries.

MHSA ADULT EQUITATION

Open to horses and ponies ridden by amateur exhibitor who have reached their 18th birthday as of December 1st of the current competition year and who are Senior Amateur members. If split by age, it shall be split 18 – 35 and 36 and older. May be combined with Junior Equitation if there are fewer than 4 entries. To be judged equally on hands, seat, control, and suitability of mount. The fence heights for the over fences class shall be 2', 2'6", and 3'. The flat class is to be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot and canter. Additional tests may be required.

Open to junior exhibitors who have not reached their 18th birthday by December 1st of the current competition year and Senior Amateur exhibitors who have reached their 18th birthday by December 1st of the current competition year. Open to horses and ponies.

INFORMATION

Optimum Time in Jump-Off: Table IV Sec. 2 (b) The first round and first jump-off are decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed. If a competitor has gone clean in the first round, the competitor will, without leaving the ring, upon an audible signal, commence the designated jump-off course. In the case of equality of faults in the jump-off, ties will be broken on the following basis: an "Optimum Time" (defined as 4 seconds less than the Time Allowed for the course) will be posted on the course plan; the horse with the time on course closest to this Optimum Time (over or under) will prevail in the tie, next closest next, etc. If there are no clear rounds, a jump-off, scored as described above, will take place among those tied for first place.

Optimum Time Power & Speed: Table IV Sec. 2 (c) The first round and first jump-off are decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed if any. If a competitor has gone clean in the first round, he will, upon crossing the finish line, commence the designated jump-off, with time starting as the horse crosses the finish line for the initial course. In the case of equality of faults in the jump-off, ties will be broken on the following basis: an "Optimum Time" (defined as 4 seconds less than the Time Allowed for the course) will be posted on the course plan; the horse with the time on course closest to this Optimum Time (over or under) will prevail in the tie, next closest next, etc. If there are no clear rounds, a jump-off, scored as described above, will take place among those tied for first place.

Time First Jump-Off: Table II, Sec. 2 (b) The first round and first jump-off, if any, is decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed. If a competitor has gone clean in the first round, the competitor will, without leaving the ring, upon an audible signal, commence the designated jump-off course. A competitor with a clear round may dismount, and with assistance if necessary, adjust tack and/or equipment; however, upon the audible signal to begin his/her round, the competitor is responsible to adhering to the 45 seconds rule as per JP134.3. A competitor who leaves the arena after a clear round (before or after the tone) will be considered to have retired from the jump-off. If there are no clear rounds and a tie exists for first place, there will be one jump-off in which time will decide in the event of equality of faults. It is recommended that no more than ten numbered obstacles be included in the first round when the class is scored under this table.

Power & Speed: Table II, Sec. 2 (c) Two Phase Competitions - The first phase to consist of 8 to 10 jumping efforts and the second phase of 5 to 7 jumping efforts. Scores are decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed if any. If a competitor has gone clean in the first phase, he will, upon crossing the finish line, commence the second phase course. Time starts as the horse crosses the finish line of the first phase. If there are no clear rounds and a tie exists for first place, the results will be determined by the scores and time from the first phase. The use of a Time Allowed is optional in the first phase. If a Time Allowed is not used in the first phase, then those with equal faults will remain tied.

- Proof of current negative Coggin's Certificate required. In accordance with MHSA rules, all MHSA Regional Program shows have adopted the USEF GR845 Equine Vaccination Rule. All horses entering the show grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the show grounds.
- The age of an individual on December 1st of the prior year will be maintained throughout the entire competition year.
- Proper show attire required for Hunter Ring. Jumper Ring allows neat & tidy.
- All riders must wear an approved riding helmet when mounted.
- All decisions by the judge are final.
- No smoking is allowed in or around the barns or in-gate areas.
- Food truck on premises.
- Trailers, please park in paddocks.
- Please, clean up after yourself and your horse.
- No dogs allowed.
- Non-showing horse fee of \$20.00. Returned check fee \$50.00.
- First three shows are qualifiers for Colonial Classic, all shows qualify for MHSA regional finals and MHSA year end points, must attend three shows to be able to qualify for series end points and receive awards at our banquet.
- The phone number for the on-call veterinarian will be on display in the show office.
- The show is run in accordance to USEF and MHSA rules.
- All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the show manager whose decision shall be final.
- Every horse entered for competition will comply with the rules of the horse show.
- Morningside Stables and the MHSA will assume no responsibility, nor is liable for any injury to person or horse at any time while on the show grounds. Morningside Stables and the MHSA will not be responsible for lost or damaged items. All owners, exhibitors, and attendees will be held responsible for any damage incurred to them or their agent's properties on the show grounds.
- An Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) will be on the horse show grounds during all riding activities the day of the show.
- Owners of all ponies showing in MHSA classes must possess a valid measurement card or a copy of a valid measurement form to be presented to the Show Secretary.
- Stalls are available overnight or for the day. \$65 overnight and \$45 for the day. Please reserve stalls ahead of time.

SHOW RING RULES

- Hunter ring opens for schooling 6:30 AM – 8AM for flatwork up through cross-rails only. We will have 2 additional schooling breaks throughout the day. No schooling in the jumper ring.
- A 3-minute gate call will be enforced. If conflicts arise, please notify the gate in advance.
- Hunter ring ties: In case of a tie score, the championship and/or reserve are awarded to the horse or rider that accumulated the most points over the fences.
- Jumper ring ties: Competitors who are tied for other than first place in all jumper sections will be placed according to "Closest to the time allowed on the initial course".
- Jumper ring rounds are judged on horse and rider pair.
- Management reserves the right to change the location of any class if necessary and to cancel or combine any classes if entries so warrant.
- 6 Ribbons awarded in all classes.
- Champion & reserve champion ribbons awarded in all divisions.

Championship Points:

First Place - 10 points • Second Place - 6 points • Third Place - 4 points
Fourth Place - 3 points • Fifth Place - 2 points • Sixth Place - 1.5 point
Seventh Place - 1 Point • Eighth Place - .5 Points

- No penalty for adds or scratches.
- Every class follows rules set forth by the MHSA & USEF rule book.

MHSA Regional Program Championships

All MHSA Divisions are by invitation only. Letters of invitation for the MHSA Regional Championship Horse Show will be e-mailed after the qualifying period has ended.

Approximately the top 20 horses/riders in each division, will be invited. To be eligible a horse/pony/rider must have shown at least two MHSA Regional Horse Shows, between the qualifying period of December 1, 2023 - October 22, 2024, and earned points in the division they would like to enter at the Championship Horse Show. Horse and rider must be members of MHSA.

The same horse/pony and rider combination that competes at any of the fall indoor shows such as Pennsylvania National, Washington International (Exception Local Hunters) or The National Horse Show is not eligible to compete at the MHSA Regional Championship Horse Show.

Qualifying for TIP Championships

To automatically qualify a T.I.P. eligible Thoroughbred must (1) participate in a show offering T.I.P. high point awards, classes or divisions beginning August 1, 2023 through August 31, 2024; or (2) participate in a Take2 division beginning August 1, 2023 through August 31, 2024; or (3) be entered in the 20234 Thoroughbred Makeover or have participated in the 2023 Makeover in the applicable discipline; or (4) have participated in the 2023 T.I.P. Performance Awards in the applicable discipline. After qualifying is completed, the qualification must be DECLARED on a Declaration Form. To qualify, horses can be shown in any classes or divisions at the show offering T.I.P. awards in the relevant discipline. All Thoroughbreds must have a T.I.P. Number to qualify.

Colonial Classic Qualifying

In order to qualify for the 2024 Colonial Classic you must first be a member of a participating local horse show series. You will then accumulate points through the season. The top 3 riders from each qualifying division will be selected by their horse show series to show at the Colonial Classic.



Eligibility

For purposes of eligibility for all T.I.P. classes and awards, a "Thoroughbred" is defined as any horse that has been registered with The Jockey Club or a foreign Thoroughbred stud book recognized by The Jockey Club. Unregistered horses are not eligible.

T.I.P. Numbers

- To participate in T.I.P., owners and riders must obtain a T.I.P. Number. To apply for a T.I.P. number, please visit tjctip.com and click on "My Account". You will need an Interactive Registration™ account to apply for a T.I.P. Number. Interactive Registration™ is a FREE service designed for the use of thoroughbred owners and breeders to transact business electronically with The Jockey Club registry. T.I.P. Numbers are free. The T.I.P. number card should be provided to participating horse shows as proof of eligibility.
- T.I.P. Numbers are horse/owner specific. If you purchase a horse with a number, you need to get a new T.I.P. Number for the horse under your own account.
- All riders must be listed on the T.I.P. Number – to add a rider, log into your account and click "Add Rider".

- All membership fees go to the cost of awards being presented at the banquet.
- There must be a minimum of 3 riders in a division to have series end points qualify.
- When filling out entry forms, use same rider name and horse show name for accuracy of points.
